As Mayor it has been my great pleasure to meet a small number of them

2013-14 was another successful year for Epping Town Council. The Town Show on July 7th enjoyed glorious weather and a bumper attendance; the toilets in the Cottis Lane car park were finally refurbished and reopened; the Christmas market again created a wonderful festive atmosphere and attracted large numbers of people; the road-facing benches on the Town Green were

turned around to look into the Green, and a blue plaque scheme was launched to commemorate notable former residents, buildings and events from Epping's long and proud history. All this, and more, was achieved without increasing the Town Council's share of residents' Council Tax, and whilst maintaining the Council's healthy finances.

Finally, one unusual distinction I had as Mayor in 2013–14 was to be the first to work with three Town Clerks. Ash Tadjrishi left in June, with Bob Whittome returning on a temporary basis until Alan Shaw joined the Council in October. Alan has done a tremendous job in his short time in the role and is a great asset to the town. I thank him, and my fellow councillors, for all they do for Epping.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Planning Committee has examined 160 Planning and tree applications in the past year. Objections have been made where we feel that a proposal will be detrimental to either neighbours or to the Town. I am pleased to note that the District Council has agreed with our views in 103 cases and in a further 19 cases applications have been withdrawn. The Town Council is the only statutory consultee whose role is to represent the views not of the wider area but exclusively of the town of Epping and we have opposed any development that threatens our green spaces or our historic buildings, whilst supporting development that enhances the economic prospects for the town. We continue to be fully engaged in the local plan process and will do everything in our power to safeguard the unique character of our town during the final stages of the plan. I am also pleased to report that we have moved to electronic presentation of planning applications which has enabled members to examine applications in more detail and make more informed decisions.
